



St. Mary-Corwin Hospital: A Tale of Two Beginnings

In 1882, a two-story boarding house in Pueblo, Colorado was converted into St. Mary's Hospital by the Sisters of Charity. That same year, Colorado Fuel & Iron Company established Corwin Hospital for its employees and their families. The company transferred ownership of Corwin Hospital to the sisters in the late 1940s, creating St. Mary-Corwin Medical Center. Today, St. Mary-Corwin Hospital continues this legacy of compassionate, outstanding care dating back to 1882.
